 - I-Lids Update (Randy) I-Lids installed at Baby Lake week prior to opening. Report will be produced at the end of year – will be posted on website. We have had a DNR – AIS inspector almost every weekend.
 - AIS Prevention / Water Quality Update (Mike) Water quality testing this year 5 times a year. Results are coming in. Things are looking normal more in-depth reporting will be posted to website.
 UofM Genomics testing 3 times a year. Dick will publish results on website.
 AIS settling plates at Baby Lake landing was fixed and replaced this spring. Dick inspects regularly, looking for Zebra Mussels.
 - Road Painting Project (Gary) \$400 for stencil \$200 for panting. Quote/proposal was preresented to Woodrow township. Approved. Township will pay for template so it can be use in other locations. Lake Assoc will pay for painting. Should be completed with in next few weeks.
 Assoc Cass County Lakes (ACCL) presented to them as well. Strong interest with other associations will be shared. Application is available for lake associations 50 % reimbursement through the DNR for paint only. Approved at last board meeting as an additional expense Paint is good for 2 -3 years before repainting.

Signage on private property – owner is getting one less formal / no DRN, being created/made – will share with another property owners. *** Board to discuss in more detail in August meeting.
